

turtle and coral populations and to ensure that sharks continue to swim our seas. There are 14,000 animals in the facility!




Stroll through Ybor City, a National Historic Landmark District in Tampa on a guided walking tour, then spend a little more time exploring on your own.

You will be led by a knowledgeable and entertaining guide, well-versed in all aspects of Ybor City history. There will be a walk down "La

Septima Avenida" (Seventh Avenue) or "Broadway," as residents know it. Seventh Avenue is not just a street but the heart of a special community, and has been designated one of the American Planning Association's (APA) Great Streets in America for its history and character.

Ybor City was founded in the 1880s by Vicente Martinez-Ybor and other cigar manufacturers and was populated by thousands of immigrants, mainly from Cuba, Spain, and Italy. For the next 50 years, workers in Ybor City's cigar factories rolled hundreds of millions of cigars annually.

Lively Ybor City is known for boutiques and vintage shops on 7th Avenue, which also hosts Cuban and Latin American eateries. The Centro Ybor mall offers indie fast food, bars, and a cinema. Housed in a 1920s bakery, Ybor City State Museum has exhibits on the cigar industry and the area's immigrant communities.
